What is CSFP?

The CSFP works to improve the health of individuals at least 60 years of age by supplementing their diets with nutritious USDA commodity foods.

Background: CSFP is a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) funded supplemental food program administered by the California Department of Social Services (CDSS). The program provides administrative funds and USDA commodities to a network of ten food banks to improve the health of seniors in California by supplementing their diets with nutritious foods.



Who: Open to seniors aged 60 and older who fall within 130% of Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.

What they need to register:

Acceptable ID displaying: name, address, D.O.B.

Open Enrollment: Accepting applications now.

What they will receive: Each month they will receive a box of food valued at \$50.00 (Free).



Food package includes:

- > Non-Fat dry milk
- UHT milk
- Juice
- > Hot or ready to eat cereal
- Rice or Pasta
- Peanut Butter or Dry Beans
- Canned Meat
- Poultry or Fish

How it works

A brief description of the operation process and necessities.

- 1. FIND Food Bank will prepackage food.
- 2. FIND Food Bank will deliver prepackaged food to the program site once per month.
- 3. Program site will organize and prepare for distribution.
- 4. Program site will distribute food packages to CSFP participants on same day delivery.
- 5. Program site will collect participant names and address on sign-in sheet during distribution.
- 6. Program site will submit participant sign-in sheet by the end of the distribution day.

Responsibilities FIND Food Bank

- Enroll eligible participants
- Pre-package food
- Schedule and deliver food to distribution site
- Monitor compliance of program site in the areas of:
 - Food handling
 - Proper Food Storing
 - Distribution procedures
 - Recording requirements
 - Conduct an annual training for:
 - Civil Rights
 - FNS Food Packaging
 - Program Regulations

Program Site

- Elect a program site coordinator
- Prepare site for monthly distribution
- Provide 4 volunteers/staff members to assist
- Provide latex gloves for sanitary purposes
- Complete and submit monthly sign-in sheet

- Complete annual training
- Maintain compliance

- 1. Allotment of approximately 3 hours for distribution.
- 2. Minimum of 4 volunteers/staff members to assist.
- 3. Latex gloves for sanitary purposes.

Understanding The Importance:

- Food insecurity is a socioeconomic condition where access to food is limited or uncertain. It differs from hunger in that hunger is a physiological feeling.
- > Hunger takes a severe toll on seniors' health and nutrition putting them at risk for chronic health conditions like depression, asthma, and diabetes.
- In 2019, 5.2 million seniors aged 60+ faced hunger. That's 1 in 14 seniors or 7.1% of all seniors.
