Program Overview

FIND Food Bank, the Desert's Regional Food Bank, is working with middle school and high school students pursuing a specific extracurricular activity through the Opportunity Bank Scholarship Program. The Opportunity Bank Scholarship, valued up to \$800, will assist students in waiving fees associated with participation in extracurricular activities that may include, but are not limited to, registration fees, equipment, transportation, or tutoring. With the support of the Opportunity Bank Scholarship and through participation in an extracurricular activity, students will enhance their life skills, build teamwork skills, and boost their future success.

Studies show that the root causes of hunger are caused by lack of equitable access to healthy and culturally relevant foods, private and public benefits, and educational and professional opportunities. The Opportunity Bank Scholarship Program was created to address the root causes of hunger specific to educational attainment, work force development and financial literacy. This program will provide access for children to opportunities that can support their development of skill sets needed to thrive in these areas in order to help them break their cycle of food insecurity and poverty.

The program is designed as an ongoing scholarship, customized to fund specific extracurricular activities that build each student's skill sets. Scholarship funds will be paid directly to the organization of the activity the student is participating in. Eligible students will have the opportunity to re-apply for the scholarship annually if student still meets eligibility criteria. The program will use those activities to guide students to build education, career, and life goals and plans. In addition, the program will include financial literacy training to recipients and their families and provide personalized case management by FIND Food Bank Community Health Workers. The program design will also provide research data to study the effectiveness of the program and how to optimize its impact.

Program Overview

Eligibility

- A Middle School or High School student in the Coachella Valley or Hi-Desert
- Monthly Household Gross Income is below 200% of Federal Poverty Level*
- Demonstrates a 2.0 Cumulative GPA or above
- Participating—or plan to participate—in an extracurricular activity**

Program Requirements

Students awarded the Opportunity Bank Scholarship will be required to

- submit a copy of their report card every semester during scholarship year to demonstrate a cumulative 2.0 GPA or above is maintained
- attend a financial literacy training, quarterly. Guardian will be required to attend a separate financial literacy training, quarterly.
- receive case management from a FIND Food Bank Community Health Worker, quarterly or case-by-case basis, with their guardian.
- participate in data collection to study program effectiveness and impact

- Educational advancement activities, including: math club, SAT/ACT prep classes, writing club, journalism, language classes, programming classes
- **Sports**, including: baseball, softball, basketball, football, soccer, volleyball, golf, tennis, wrestling, cheerleading, cross country, swimming, track, water polo, lacrosse, hockey, intramural sports
- Performing Arts, including: dance, ballet, theater
- Creative and Fine Arts, including: art, music, pottery, photography, sewing
- Other Extracurricular Activities, including: gardening, farming, auto shop, building and construction, culinary
- Leadership Programs, including: leadership camps, workshops, public speaking, public advocacy workshops

INCOME ELIGIBILITY STANDARDS

The Federal Poverty Guidelines is a measure of income issued every year by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). Federal poverty levels are used to determine your eligibility for certain programs and benefits. The 2024 federal poverty level (FPL) income numbers below are used to calculate eligibility for the Opportunity Bank Scholarship Program.

How to Calculate Your Gross Income

- 1. Determine your Household Size
- Households can be as small as one person if that person is not a dependent
- 2. Gather your Monthly Earned Income for Everyone Earning Income in the Household
- Wages or salaries earned from a job
- Earnings from self-employment
- 3. Add your Earned Gross Income to Calculate Household's Monthly Gross Income
- 4. Use the table below to determine if your Monthly Gross Income is Eligible
